COUNSELING SERVICES provides a variety of services designed to support Marines, Sailors and their families with personal and family concerns. Through counseling, advocacy, and education programs, our compassionate staff strives to empower and encourage our community.

Our Services Include:

- Screenings and Referrals are provided by licensed counselors and are available on a walk-in basis from 1300-1500 Monday through Friday.
- Counseling is available to individuals and couples with a priority given to active duty. We also offer Combat Operational Stress Workshops.
- Family Advocacy Program (FAP) services are provided to individuals and/or families involved with family violence or sexual assault.
 - Victim Advocates provide direct services to victims of spouse abuse or sexual assault and are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
 - FAP Groups are available by referral and are designed to assist individuals and couples improve and enrich their personal lives.
 - Men’s Education Group
 - Women’s Education Group
 - Domestic Violence Support Group
 - Power Workshop
 - Women in Relationships Workshop
