

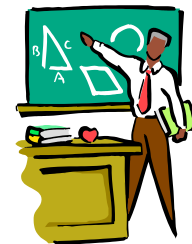
THE MILITARY ACADEMIC SKILLS PROGRAM (MASP)

1. What is it?

- ▶ **MASP** is an on-duty educational program designed to improve the competencies of **active duty enlisted personnel/dependents/civilians** in the academic skills of **math and English**.
- ▶ **MANDATORY** for all active duty military students who are using tuition assistance for the first time, and who have a GT of 99 or below, and failed to achieve a grade 10.2 on the **Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE)**. Completion of MASP is required prior to submitting requests for tuition assistance.
- ▶ Upon completion of the course, **MASP** students should be able to:
 - **Improve** basic skills in English and math
 - **Improve** their ability to successfully complete college level courses
 - **Prepare** for promotion
 - **Score higher** on the **AFCT/ASVAB**
 - **Increase** their General Technical (GT) or AFQT scores on the ASVAB
 - **Become competitive** in today's military and civilian job markets

2. How does MASP operate?

- ▶ **MASP** can accommodate up to 30 students per session.
- ▶ Teachers specializing in adult education provide instruction in a traditional classroom setting.
- ▶ **All** students must meet a minimum number of instructional and supervised study hours. **Class is held in the JEC, Bldg 1331, Mon-Fri from 0730 to 1600, for four weeks.**



3. Are there any prerequisites?

- ▶ With command support, any active duty, enlisted service member who's EAS allows sufficient time to complete a future course, may schedule the **Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE) pretest. This pretest is also required for interested dependents and civilians.** Come to the Joint Education Center, Bldg 1331, or call (760) 725-6660/6414 to schedule the **TABE**.
- ▶ Active duty personnel must have permissive TAD orders from their units to attend the MASP program.
