Screenings are provided each morning and anyone seeking assistance throughout the day is assisted. SACC services include:

- Prevention Services
- Early Intervention Program
- Individual Counseling
- Group Treatment
- Continuing Care
- Outpatient Program (OP) is designed for individuals who have a substance use disorder of mild severity
- Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) is designed for individuals who have a substance use disorder of moderate severity
- Facilitate the placement in residential treatment for individuals who have a substance abuse disorder of significant severity

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE (SAPR)

The SAPR team is led by two Installation Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs) and a team of experienced victim advocates.

The SAPR team provides:

- 24/7 sexual assault crisis intervention for all service members, spouses, and adult dependents
- Advocacy and accompaniment during medical procedures, law enforcement interviews, and judicial proceedings

Installation SARC's provide credentialed 40 hour training to newly appointed SAPR Victim Advocates and Command SARCs.

The New Parent Support Program is a professional team of clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and registered nurses who are experienced in newborn care, infant/child development, parent education, as well as, the unique challenges faced by military families. NPSP is an intensive prevention and outreach program that offers:

- In-home visits
- Parenting education classes
- Baby Boot Camp
- Information and referrals for active duty personnel and family members who are either expecting a child, or have children under the age of six

The New Parent Support Program can help families adjust to having a new baby, cope with stress, isolations, pre and post deployment, reunification, and the everyday demands of parenting in the military.
